This individual sport, also known as ring jousting, perfectly blends horsemanship with speed and precision. Riders gallop down a field, attempting to spear three hanging rings, ranging from 1 3/4" to 1/4" in diameter.

As some may know, I (Gary) have recently assumed the responsibilities of the Christ Church Jousting Field Chairman. While the transition has been mostly smooth, we have encountered a significant challenge - securing enough volunteers for the event.
