Every Lent invites us to prepare for new life. Lent challenges us to get ready for our resurrected Easter life by stripping away everything that stands in the way of Jesus: "let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God" (Hebrews 12:1b-2).

Lent this year invites to reflect on ourselves not only as individuals but also as a congregation. Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, on 14 February this year. Come to the church on Ash Wednesday for Holy Eucharist and Imposition of Ashes at 7:30 a.m., noon, and 7 p.m. (Drive-thru ashes will also be offered in front of the Parish Hall from 4 to 5 p.m.) Lenten reading material for all ages will be available in the Parish Hall and in the church beginning on Sunday, 4 February.


Join us on the six Fridays in Lent (16 & 23 February & 1, 8, 15, & 22 March) for Lenten fellowship evenings of worship, a simple supper, and study. We begin in the church at 6 p.m. with Stations of the Cross, followed by a simple soup supper in the Parish Hall. After supper, we'll watch & discuss the Rev Matt Rawle's series *Jesus Revealed: the I Am Statements in the Gospel of John*. Join us for part or all of each evening's events, as your schedule permits, and bring a friend.

As most of you know, I announced recently that I will retire as rector of Christ Church at the end of this September. On our bishop's advice, I announced my retirement relatively early, so that we could begin a congregational self-study very soon and move on to a rector search well before my last Sunday (29 September). Much like the personal reflection that lies at the heart of Lent, a congregation's self-study invites us to look honestly at ourselves as a congregation. What are our strengths? What are our challenges? How are we serving Christ well? Where do we fall short? What type of rector will help us grow (collectively) into Christ-likeness: how can we get ready together for our resurrected Easter life? The vestry will soon choose teams to lead our self-study and to lead us in search. If you would like to serve on either team (self-study or search) (or nominate someone else to serve), please contact our Senior Warden, any member of the vestry, or me.

Please join us on **Shrove Tuesday**, the last day before Lent, for a wonderful evening of fellowship and feasting, for the **Fat Tuesday pancake supper**, from **5 to 7:30 p.m.** in the Parish Hall.

Finally, our new bishop coadjutor, the Rt Rev Carrie Schofield-Broadbent, will be with us on Sunday, 10 March. We'll have one worship service that day, at 10 a.m., followed by a finger-food reception in the Parish Hall. The bishop's visit is the traditional time for confirmation, reception into The Episcopal Church (for those coming from certain other denominations), renewal of baptismal vows, and Holy Baptism. If you wish to prepare for one of these sacraments, please let me know right away.

for Women's Kits Hygiene Prison. The Warden and Chaplain at the women's prison have reached out to the faith-based organizations asking them to help provide 620 hygiene kits for the entire Maryland Correctional Institution - Women (MCI-W) population. Contrary to popular belief, prisons provide very little for women in this area. The women inside MCI-W must provide their own hygiene products by working within the institution or through the generosity of family. Jobs are limited inside, and the pay is peanuts. And the canteen where these items are available is privately run and the charge for everything is prohibitive. Items that will be allowed in the kits will be shampoo, body wash, lotion, dove soap, toothpaste, pads. Total cost sanitary \$30.00. Unfortunately, approximately individuals cannot purchase these items and send them directly to the prison. The go in to have kits will together. LOVE IS AN ACTION!


Love is about doing for others. For this Valentine's Day (or any other time of the year), create a coupon book that helps you serve others with love.




Express your love and friendship with handcrafted bracelets.

What you need:

- Saucepan
- 2 tablespoons of butter
- 2 or 3 bags of miniature marshmallows
- 4 cups of crisp-rice cereal (regular or chocolate)
- 9 x 13 pan
- Heart-shaped cookie cutter
- Bag of chocolate chips (milk or white chocolate)
- Bowl

CALLING NEW VESTRY MEMBERS

Voting Members who are exploring a possible call by the Lord to Vestry service are expected to take full opportunity to prayerfully learn prior to the Parish Annual Meeting as much as possible about the duties, responsibilities, dynamics, challenges, and joys of Vestry service; please speak with any Vestry member or Officer. Election to the Vestry will be held at the Parish Annual Meeting on April 14, 2024. "Voting Members shall be nominated from the floor by another Voting Member at the annual meeting. No nominations for Vestry member shall be accepted unless the person nominated has agreed to serve if elected."


NOTE: "Voting Members: are persons at least 18 years of age who have been Ordinary Members for at least six months, and who are enrolled in this Parish, for the period aforesaid, as communicants-in-good-standing and as contributors. ("Communicants-in-goodstanding" have received Holy Communion at least three times during the preceding year and are faithful in corporate worship unless for good cause prevented, and in working, praying, and giving, for the spread of the Kingdom of God.) Also, the Safe Church Policy of The Episcopal Diocese of Maryland requires Officers and Vestry members to complete a criminal records check, a sexual offender registry check, a reference background check, and to hold training certificates from this Diocese in both "Prevention of Child Sexual Misconduct" and "Prevention of Adult Sexual Misconduct."

The self-study team will form first, and will begin its work soon. The search team will form later. Both teams will require much work; the search team will also require some travel.
