Return my text. Fr Christopher Garcia." These requests were fraudulent—look carefully; they come from the wrong phone number or wrong email address. Our clergy will <u>never</u> send you a text, email, or phone call asking for a "favor," to buy gift cards, wire funds, or otherwise send money. If you receive such a request, report it to your cell-phone or email fraud department, block the sender, and delete the request. Criminals send millions of these requests, hoping to prey on the generosity and trust of a few (especially at this time of year). Please don't be taken in.

NO-SEW FLEECE SCARF


Winter is a difficult time for people in need, so make this scarf to help someone stay warm.

What you need:

- Medium-weight polar fleece, 60" standard width (a 9" portion will make one scarf)
- Scissors
- An adult to help

What you do:

- 1. Cut a piece of mediumweight polar fleece to the size of 60" x 9". Cut the fabric across its width so the material is stretchy.
- 2. Trim off the edge binding. To add "fringe" along each end, make a 6"-long cut every half inch.
- For curly fringe, pull each strand and then let go sharply. Another attractive option is to tie an overhand knot at the top of each strip.
- 4. Donate your scarf to a local group that helps people in need. For greater impact, encourage your Sunday school classmates or other friends to make scarves, too.
