Alleluia! Christ is risen! Our Easter celebration of the risen Jesus continues for seven Sundays, ending with Pentecost Sunday, when we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit and the birthday of the universal church. (Pentecost Sunday this year falls on 19 May.) Throughout Eastertide, we explore the post-resurrection appearances of Jesus to his disciples, and consider what it means for *us* to live as people of the resurrection.

At our Annual Meeting on 14 April we elected the officers and new vestry members who will help lead us in the years ahead. Reelected to two-years renewable terms were Nancy Zinn as Senior Warden; Bart Ewalt as Junior Warden; Jim Yoe as Treasurer; Helen Prince as Registrar, and Norman Prince as Delegate to Diocesan Council. Dave Campbell and Sandy Hall were elected to new four-year nonrenewable terms as vestry members, to serve until 2028. Thank all of these volunteers for giving their time and talent.

Our officers and vestry members help lead us, but in this time of transition, remember that *every* member's role in Christ Church is vital. We are a small church, and we cannot afford to have anyone sit back and wait and watch. We need everyone to roll up your sleeves, pitch in, and get involved. The risen Jesus is with us here – God is doing great things at Christ Church – and we need *everyone* to share that message with the world around us. Your friends, neighbors, and family members are hungry and yearning for community, connection, and meaning in their lives: help them find it here, at Christ Church.

NEW VESTRY MEMBERS

Dave Campbell and Sandy Hall were elected to the Vestry at the Parish Meeting on April 14, 2024. Dave is serving her first term as Vestry member and this is the second time Sandy has served on the Vestry. We are spotlighting our new Vestry members this month.

Dave Campbell grew up attending St. George's Episcopal Church in Newport, RI. He was baptized and confirmed there and was a member of the Junior Choir before his voice changed. St. George's was closed by the RI diocese in 2007 and folded into St. Mary's Episcopal Church due to dwindling attendance.

Dave was born and raised in Newport, Rhode Island, the grandchild of immigrants from Scotland, Ireland, and England. His father serviced coal and oil burners, and his mother was a secretary at the US Naval War college. Dave's brother Alan was born with cerebral palsy and died at age 5 from pneumonia. Dave attended public schools in Newport from kindergarten through high school. He received a B.S. in Zoology at the University of Rhode Island, the first in his family to graduate from college. Dave worked his way through college as a dock worker unloading commercial fishing trawlers. He received a M.S. in marine biology from the Florida Institute of Technology and a Ph.D. in biological sciences at the University of Rhode Island.

Dave met Shannon Briscoe in the US Virgin Islands while he was teaching a course in coral reef ecology for the School for Field Studies. Four years later (in 1987) they married in Christ Church. Dave and Shannon have two children, Cassie (34) and Liam (31). Both Cassie and Liam were baptized and confirmed in Christ Church, and both served as acolytes before they went off to college. Liam is an elementary

school counselor in Fort Myers, Florida, and Cassie is in the last year of her Ph.D. program at the University of South Florida in Tampa.

Dave started snorkeling at age 7 and was SCUBA diving by age 18. He is a NAUI certified assistant SCUBA instructor. For most of his life SCUBA diving has been "work" necessary for his research, and only recently since retirement has he considered it a "hobby." Dave has tried to find opportunities to serve the community when possible. He was an EMT with the Durham, NH ambulance corps and the hyperbaric recompression chamber at the University of New Hampshire. Dave was a member of the Board of Directors for Sigma Xi, the honor society for scientific research. More recently he served on the Board of Directors of the Calvert Marine Museum. Presently he serves on the Board of Directors for the One Room Schoolhouse, he is a member of the Calvert County Forestry Board, and Dave is chair of the Calvert County Environmental Commission.

He is presently retired. Shannon and he devote much of their time maintaining farm property and the associated rental houses on the farm. As for his career background, he was visiting assistant professor in the Zoology Dept. at the University of New Hampshire (1983-1986) and taught summer field marine science courses for Cornell University's Shoals Marine Laboratory (1984-2010). He was an associate professor in the Biology Dept. of Rider University (1986-2001) and helped to institute the University's marine biology and environmental science majors. Dave was a Program Director in the Division of Research and Education at the National Science Foundation from 2001 to 2019. He worked with several programs at NSF, managing awards focusing on science education research at the

high school level and technology education programs at community colleges. Dave was honored to receive two 3-month US Embassy science fellowships while at NSF, one in Philippines and one in Palau.

When asked, what brought you to Christ Church? Dave said "Shannon was raised in Christ Church, as were her parents and several generations before that. We lived in Pennsylvania from 1987-1997 and moved to Saint Leonard in 1997. (Well, I moved; Shannon moved back.) We have been regular

Dave was asked, what do you like about Christ Church? He said, "I like the congregants of Christ Church. I have always felt welcome here. I like the physical size of the church; it makes one feel welcome and comfortable. However, I would like to see the size of the congregation grow some."


