75th Anniversary of MJTA

On March 29, 2025,the MJTA celebrated their 75th Anniversary. They had requested that Christ Church write something for their program since they have been so supportive of our Jousting Tournament.

Dave Campbell wrote this wonderful tribute from Christ Church which we wanted to share with you.

On behalf of the vestry and congregation of Christ Church, we congratulate the Maryland Jousting Tournament Association on its 75th anniversary. We hope the Association will be around for another 75 years. The jousting tournament at Christ Church celebrated its 157th anniversary last year, and we plan to continue, so don't expect to catch up to us.

What we now call 'tournament day' at Christ Church began as a celebration at the end of summer. Calvert County was almost exclusively a farming community, and the timing concurred with the tobacco harvest. This was years before there was such a thing as Labor Day. The day began with jousting, a country supper, and ended with a tournament dance. The Knight who captured the most rings would crown the Lady of his choice "The Queen of Love and Beauty." The jousting field was a mile from the church, and often had to be moved depending on what crops had been planted.

Today there is no longer a dance, and several fund raising activities take place along with the jousting. The jousters include excellent riders from across the state, not only riders from local families (although we still have a few). The tournament draws large numbers of people from Calvert County and adjoining counties as well.

The jousting tournament has become the centerpiece of our annual event, to the mutual benefit of Christ Church and the MJTA. In Christ Church's outreach efforts to the community, it is quite often we hear people say, "You're the church with the jousting tournament." As people have become more mobile and move to Maryland from elsewhere, the novelty of a jousting tournament is irresistible. The tournament provides newcomers an appreciation of the history and an education of Maryland's official state sport.

We appreciate our relation with the MJTA and hope to continue working together for many years to come.
