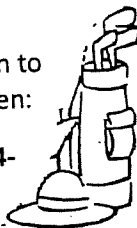

Every last Saturday of August, the oldest continuous jousting tournament in America takes place right here in Calvert County at Christ Church. This individual sport, also known as ring jousting, perfectly blends horsemanship with speed and precision. Riders gallop down a field, attempting to spear three hanging rings, ranging from 1 3/4" down to 1/4" in diameter. It's an amazing test of athletic skill and horsemanship!

As with prior tournaments, it's a busy day and volunteers are needed to help make the tournament a success. Duties may include assisting with rider registration, or hanging rings at the arches of the tournament course. We need your help! So, we are reaching out to the community and would be thrilled if you could serve as a volunteer for the Joust. If you can't volunteer, we kindly ask you to spread the word to anyone you think might be interested in volunteering. GROUNDS & FIELD PREPARATION

Preparation of the Tournament Field and Grounds will begin on Wednesday, August 27th @ 6:30 p.m. (Rain Date August 29th). We will then prepare as much of the Jousting area as weather will allow.
